

1st International Geosciences Student Conference

Bucharest, April 22nd – 24th, 2010

Selection Process:

The Scientific Committee will consider all extended abstracts submitted to the IGSC Committee office by 15 March 2010 and authors will be notified by the end of March 2010. The technical programme selection meeting has then taken place and the technical programme with definite session titles and presentation allocation is composed.

Each extended abstract will be reviewed by at least 2 referees prior to the technical programme selection meeting. The selection process is no formality, abstracts being subject to rejection in case of lack of relevance or coherency.

The extended abstracts must be relevant to one of the conference topics. Authors are requested to indicate the topic under which their extended abstract should be evaluated by the referees. Authors should also indicate their preference for either an oral or a poster presentation; certain material is more suitable for poster presentations, due to the details that need to be studied and discussed in more depth.

Expanded Abstract:

Titles should be short (max. 120 characters) and relevant. A summary of the extended abstract (max. 200 words) must be submitted as well. Extended abstracts must be in English, original and not have appeared in any other publication.

A good extended abstract consists of an introduction, the main description of theory or method broken down as appropriate and illustrated with figures, conclusions, optional acknowledgements and references. It should reflect work that is actually completed at the time of submission and not plans or ideas that are still taking shape in the mind of the author or research that is still highly immature.

The extended abstract must concentrate in itself the essential information of the presentation: purpose, methods, results and conclusions. It should be an abbreviated, informative, accurate representation of the presentation and not a mere recital of the subjects to be covered.

Publication:

The accepted extended abstract is published on the DVD-ROM, which is official IGSC Committee publication, as submitted. Badly written extended abstracts not only reflect poorly on the authors, but also on the associations. Many more people read the accepted extended abstracts than those attending the presentation. Therefore IGSC Committee will only consider properly written and informative extended abstracts that are submitted in line with the template instructions.

Copyright will remain with the IGSC Committee unless a release from this condition is obtained at the time of submission. Copyright will return to the author 6 months after presentation, if by that time he or she has not been informed that the IGSC Committee intends to extend the copyright.

Layout of extended abstract:

- For abstracts please use the template offered by us.
- You do not need to make a coverpage for your extended abstract as IGSC Committee will make this for you with the title, authors and summary. Please do not include this information in the body text of your extended abstract. Please start the body text of your extended abstract directly under the IGSC 2010 logo.

- The body of the extended abstract needs to be at most four A4 pages in length. Longer sized abstracts will be rejected. The extended abstract should consist of text and appropriate figures supporting the key message. The text should contain about 1,000 words and at least one figure. Four pages of text alone are unacceptable.
- Please do not use more than 1 column, do not frame the text, and please upload the body of your extended abstract as one document with embedded figures.
- Please use the font Times New Roman 11 pts with single line spacing, set the alignment as justified and use the standard Word outline level (body text).
- The margins which must be used are as follows:
 - Top - 2.54cm (1")
 - Bottom - 2.54cm (1")
 - Left & right - 2.54cm (1")
- The lay-out of the references should be consistent with the style guide for references in the EAGE First Break guidance for authors, which can be found at this link: <http://fb.eage.org/other.php?id=7> . Please ensure every citation has a reference and vice versa.
- Number the figures sequentially, according to their appearance in the text, and check that each figure is cited in the text.
- Supply a short caption for each figure; more detailed discussion of the figure can be reserved for the text. Further information about the use of figure captions and figure numbering can be found in the EAGE First Break guidance for Authors.
